Main points to note

- Across all fundraising activities year to date (being the state and federal election BBQs, End
 of Term 1 and Term 2 sausage sizzles, Trivia Night, Movie Night and the Second Hand
 Uniform Sale), we made total profit of appox to \$21,600
- This includes some expenses for multicultural fair
- Year to date, the net profit for the head P&C fund is \$26,331. This compares to \$25,253 at
 Sept. Improvement is due to money from new uniform sales from the uniform shop offset by expenditure for multicultural fair, gardening and P&C general expenses
- Expected future income
 - Sponsorship from Artarmon Village and Artarmon Dentist
 - Revenue from multicultural fair and raffle sales
 - End of Term 3 Sausage sizzle deposit
- Expected future outgoings
 - Sponsorship of the UR strong program (subsidising \$10 per ticket for the first 100 tickets purchased for both the lower and upper primary sessions). Total cost approx.
